Bishop Clay Lee Special Guest Preacher Sunday, September 30

Clay Lee, Bishop of the Holston conference (Knoxville area) for 8 years, will preach at OU on September 30 as part of the commemoration of the integration of Ole Miss. He served faithfully in the Mississippi conference during this tumultuous time in our history.

Born in Laurel, MS, in 1930, he earned his bachelor degree from Millsaps University in 1951. He has

a Bachelor of Divinity degree from Candler School of Theology at Emory University. He received a honorary Doctor of Divinity degree at Millsaps College in 1985. He served the Capitol Street Church in Jackson as Associate Pastor; as the Pastor of the Raymond Church; The First Methodist Church in Quitman; Galloway Memorial Church as Minister of Evangelism; Philadelphia's First Methodist; and the Leavell Woods Church in Jackson. Rev. Lee then was appointed the Executive Director of the Conference Council on Ministry; then as Superintendent of the Brookhaven District, and finally as the Senior Minister of the Galloway Memorial U.M.C. in Jackson. He and his wife Dot live in Jackson. They have five adult children (including OU's Lisa Mullins), and eight grandchildren.

What's the difference in the Good Samaritan Fund & Interfaith Compassion Ministries?

Your contributions to both of these ministries are being used to help those in our community who are in need of a meal, lodging, or other emerging needs. Offerings designated to either are accounted for separately. For example, our First Sunday Holy Communion offering is designated to **Interfaith** and the contributions are dispersed to ICM, usually on the following Monday. In addition to that particular offering, your church has a line item within the Mission budget that supports the work of ICM. This year that amount is \$12,000.00. Because of your faithful giving and support of ICM, OUUMC has passed along \$40,759.19 this year in support of the work of ICM.

The **Good Samaritan Fund** was formerly known as the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, and has been in existence over ten years. Its purpose is to meet the needs of those who for various reasons cannot be helped through ICM. For instance, ICM may be closed or the person seeking assistance may not be a resident of the county. This account is funded through the budget and designated gifts. This year, distributions have been made for needs ranging from lodging to meals to car repair to prescribed medications, and total \$11,356.60.

OUUMC is truly hearing the call to help those who are need, and we are awed by your generosity!

Notes from the Past

EIGHTY YEARS AGO: At their meeting on September 1, 1932, the Board of Stewards learned that a deed of trust had been left to the board by W. G. Roberds. Mr. Sneed was “authorized to dispose of the horse and wagon to the best of his ability.”

SIXTY YEARS AGO: At the first of September 1952, Pastor A. L. Meadows wrote: “Upon our arrival in Oxford, on June 19, to assume the ministerial duties of the Oxford-University Methodist Church, we were met with a cordiality and a spirit of helpful cooperation which has made us increasingly happy to be assigned to this work. The official board, along with the WSCS, has replenished both the parsonage and church office with new and necessary items for comfort and service. There is a healthy spiritual atmosphere among the membership of the church.”

On September 5, 1952, members of the Board of Stewards discussed the possibility of having two services on Sunday mornings. “The general feeling of the board was that if there is need for two services, such can be arranged.”

FIFTY YEARS AGO: The September 2, 1962, bulletin called attention to the need for “every type household furniture for the new Wesley Foundation Center at University Avenue and 5th Street.”

On September 16, 1962, the Wesley Foundation had a Welcome Supper in Wesley Hall at 5:30 p.m.

FORTY YEARS AGO: The community welcomed Mr. and Mrs. Leslie Nabors and their children in September 1972. Mr. Nabors preached his first sermon at St. Andrew’s United Methodist Church on September 3, 1972.

THIRTY YEARS AGO: T. J. Brown, Mary Brown, Joe Larson, Geneva Perrine, and Kim Upton joined the church in September 1982.

The Bill Champion family gave the altar flowers on September 5, 1982. Infant Flyn Lee Flesher was baptized on September 5, 1982.

Chancellor Porter Fortune welcomed students to church on September 12, 1982.
